FACILITATION HELP: RESOURCE THEM

Students who succeed in discipleship on their own have been given excellent resources to do so. It's true that some have enough grit to make it on their own despite any challenge, but give them tools to stay faithful in the midst of life challenges. Expose your students to great resources that you've learned from. Books, concordances, people, blogs, and conferences are all great resources for growing in discipleship. Let them know which ones are biblically sound and trustworthy. Give them resources in addition to the Scripture they have learned that will be available to them when you can't be. Eventually they will move on from your group and these resources will remain to help them navigate the hard times.
