

FACILITATION HELP: ROUND TABLES

Maybe you have one of those groups that won't engage in conversation. Maybe you find it difficult to get your students to respond. Sometimes it isn't the students that need to change, it might be us and how we operate as leaders that needs to change. They spend a lot of their day with someone standing over them asking them questions. Try changing your position or even the setup of the room. Change it from a classroom to a living room. Use a circular structure like round tables or a circle of chairs. That way everyone looks at each other and nobody is standing over them, which can be intimidating.

When Jesus says that they will bear much fruit, He reminds them that their obedience is important in this process as well.
