FACILITATION HELP: REINING IN THE TANGENT.

Sometimes conversations can take a left turn. One interesting comment somewhat related to the question you just posed sparks a thought loosely related to that one. Then the associations rush through the group until everyone is laughing and no one knows how you started talking about whatever you were talking about. Many times those tangents are really good, even necessary, to address serious questions your students have. Even laughter can be a welcome break during a heavy discussion. But when they become distracting and unhelpful to the growth of the group, it's time to rein it in. It is your job to gently but firmly jump in and restate the question to refocus the group on the topic at hand.
