

▶ LESSON 2.1: MOSES

STUDENTS STUDIED:

Students Learned the Following Definitions:

MOSAIC COVENANT: the covenant Moses mediated between God and Israel at Mount Sinai when Israel received the law (including the Ten Commandments)

THE LAW: the commands of God given through Moses to provide knowledge of sin (Romans 3:20), show His righteousness (Romans 7:12) and lead people to Christ (Galatians 3:17–25)

THE LAW OF MOSES: It often refers to the five books of Moses and is synonymous with the Mosaic Covenant (Joshua 8:30–35).

Students learned how God will equip them for the job He calls them to.	Students studied the purpose of the law. They studied the story of the burning bush, where God called Moses to be a deliverer for the Hebrews. Moses felt inadequate, but God promised to be with him and give him what he needed to do the job.	They read about God giving Moses the Ten Commandments for the Hebrews. Christians no longer live under the law; we live under the grace of Jesus. But the law continues to remind us of God's standards, encourage us toward godly living and show us our deep need for a Savior: Jesus Christ. ⁴	They studied Moses' experience with the Hebrews at the border of the promised land. The people complained against God and did not want Moses to be their leader anymore. Despite such opposition, Moses continued to serve the role God called him to, and God was with Moses.	Moses shared the law God gave him with not one generation of Hebrews but two. After Jesus conquered death on the cross, Christians were called to share the Gospel. Like Moses, we should share God's words with the people around us.

IDENTITY INSIGHT:

God has equipped me with everything I need to follow His plans for my life. I can trust He is always with me and will guide me in the way I should go (Isaiah 30:21), even when following His call is hard.

DISCUSSION

► SHARE

Begin a discussion about calling by sharing your own. Tell students how you discerned what God's calling for your life was?

► ASK

God spoke to Moses and informed him of his calling in a unique way. Invite students to share what they know about God's call on their life. Ask them what roadblocks have they come across in their pursuit of God's call on their life and how they overcame them.

► ACT

Encourage students to take time this week during their devotions to pray about God's specific calling on their life, both now (in the immediate) and for the future (vocationally/professionally). Pray as a group that the Lord would speak to each student clearly, granting them wisdom and equipping them to do His will.
